I am delighted to present to you this report on the many great achievements of our staff and the clients we served in 2006. One of the most impressive is the growth we have experienced in our Community Outreach Program.

Our advocates fielded 4,109 calls on our crisis line in 2006, up 1,666 (or 40%) from 2004. Total number of area families served in 2006 was 1263, compared to 743 in 2004. Through the Community Outreach Program we strive to connect with, educate and counsel the 97% of victims of violence who may not need or want to go to shelter, but are in no less danger than those who choose to.

I want to thank the Turning Point staff for their professionalism, perseverance and compassion and I want to recognize the strength and courage of our victims/ families. As a former victim myself, the one statistic that I believe speaks volumes for our programs' effectiveness, and of which I am particularly proud is:

Nationally, the average number of domestic violence victims who do not immediately return to their assailants following a shelter stay is between 30 and 45%. At Turning Point, over 71% of our clients leaving shelter do so without immediately returning to their abuser.

In closing, I ask that you consider a gift to Turning Point this year. Your generosity is essential to the success of our families victimized by violence. Many thanks.

## Excerpts taken from presentation by Executive Director, Patrick Smith...

Domestic Violence is a core problem out of which many of our most challenging community issues arise. It is core to child abuse. It is core to juvenile delinquency. It is core to adult criminal behavior. It is often core to addictive behaviors and mental illness. It is core to delayed educational development. Domestic Violence is not just another social problem. It is at the center of and is causal for many of our most troubling community concerns.

Let me tell you about 4 hours of one day I had sometime in the last 6 months. I was in the plant of one of our regional manufacturing facilities...

A plant employee came by. She was the Mother of a daughter who received services from Turning Point in the past two years. Her daughter was raped and held hostage in her home by her husband, whom she met as a co-worker at another (local) manufacturer ... She tearfully claims her daughter is alive today because of the Prosecutors office and Turning Point and wanted to say thank you.

Next, I met a woman in her thirties who grew up in a violent household, "watching my Dad beat my Mom all the time." When I asked her if she had managed to avoid being victimized as an adult, she glared at me and said something our tougher folks often say, "If a man ever hits me, it better be a good one, because I guarantee you he won't get another chance." I believed her.

Next, a man came by. I asked if he was familiar with Turning Point and our services and he said "I am becoming familiar with you. You have helped my wife." Uncertain whether this was just a bad male joke we often hear, I waited before responding.

Then he started to say more. Like most abusers, he saw himself as the real victim. I have no doubt he was abusive.

Next, a woman who had raised two daughters while in an extremely abusive relationship for 27 years. She had been out of the relationship for 12 years now. She said we were not around when she needed help. I apologized we could not help her when she needed us, and when I tried to encourage her by starting to talk about all the progress we were making, she said, "and you're not doing enough now."

Lastly, with a co-worker at her side, a woman in her early twenties whose sister was getting help from Turning Point in another county came by to say thanks. All of these conversations unfolded in one four hour time frame at one place. Mother, daughter, grandchild, abuser, workplace, adult child who grew up in it, victim, 2 daughters, abuser, sister, church, abusive father-in law, co-worker...

Not a story you have read has been made up. Each is real!... And yet, I am hopeful, because I know where we have been and I can see where we are going. Our progress is significant and it reflects not just the growth and good work of Turning Point

staff, but also the broader engagement and commitment of many parties within our communities...

The woman who was victimized in her marriage 40 years ago was right when she said to me "you were not there for me." That statement applies to Turning Point and to all of our service areas. We were not there for her when she needed us. We have not always been there and domestic violence has festered and grown. Now we are here and we are making good progress, but not yet doing enough. She's right again. Let's keep working at it. The stakes are very high and victims and children continue to show us that they will, in fact, succeed in large numbers when provided with the support they deserve.

## New Volunteer Program off to a Great Start!

In August of 2006, thanks to a grant from the Heritage Fund, The Community Foundation of Bartholomew County, Turning Point hired Anne Courtney for the newly created position of Volunteer Coordinator. From family mentoring and client transport to childcare and facility maintenance, Anne found the community ready and willing to help.

From August 2006 to May 2007, volunteers have provided over 1,700 hours of volunteer service including 600 hours of "essential operational duties" allowing staff additional time to concentrate on client services.

We now have over 19 regular volunteers and our numbers continue to increase. When asked why she chose Turning Point, one volunteer responded that she chose to volunteer at Turning Point through her own past experience in an abusive marriage. - ✳ **Children's Program** Safety, child advocacy, assessment, special needs resourcing, family case management, support groups, domestic violence education and school liaison.
- ✳ **24 Hour Toll-Free Help/Crisis Line 1-800-221-6311.** Call does not appear on caller's phone statement.
- ✳ **Legal Advocacy Program** Assistance with filing Emergency Protective Orders, advising and supporting clients before Permanent Protective Order hearings, providing information about divorce, child custody, child support, law enforcement and public assistance issues, and referring victims to attorneys and other social service agencies.
